

GODLY ATTITUDES SEEN IN SEASONS OF REVIVAL

“He will turn many of the sons of Israel back to the Lord their God. It is he who will go as a forerunner before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah, TO TURN THE HEARTS OF THE FATHERS BACK TO THE CHILDREN, and **the disobedient to the attitude of the righteous**, so as to make ready a people prepared for the Lord” (Luke 1:16-17 NASB).

- 1 Pray that the church in America will become characterized in this generation as the people who **love** God with all their heart, soul, and might (Deuteronomy 6:5).
- 2 Just as Jesus challenged Peter after his denial to demonstrate his renewed **love** for Christ by doing that which He commanded him to do (John 21:15-17), pray that your church family will do the same—that they will hear God’s voice and obey every command given to them through the Word and the Spirit’s guidance (John 14:15, 21).
- 3 Pray that today’s church will be filled with gladness over all God has done for them and will sing for **joy** over the works of His hands (Psalm 92:4).
- 4 As the church encounters various trials today, pray that we will do so with great **joy**, knowing that the testing of our faith produces endurance, the quality that helps us become “perfect and complete, lacking in nothing” (James 1:2-4).
- 5 In the midst of tumultuous days, pray that your church family will not let their hearts be troubled or shrouded in fear, but will instead walk in the **peace** God gives to His children (John 14:27).
- 6 Pray that Christians who are being persecuted because of their faith will be filled with courage and experience **peace**, knowing that they can take courage because the Jesus who lives within them has overcome the world (John 16:33).
- 7 Pray that your Christian friends will **trust** in the Lord with all their hearts and will not lean on their own understanding as they deal with the daily issues of life (Proverbs 3:5).
- 8 Pray that today’s Christians will lift up their souls before the Lord and **trust** in Him. Also pray that God will not let them be ashamed or have their spiritual enemies exult over them (Psalm 25:1-2).
- 9 With some of today’s churches facing mountainous challenges in the realms of reaching the lost and making disciples, pray that their **faith** in God will grow to the point where “nothing will be impossible” for them (Matthew 17:20).
- 10 Pray that when the Christians in your church and community are being tempted to sin, they will strengthen one another in Christ Jesus and manifest the type of **faith** in God that will not fail (Luke 22:31-32).
- 11 In light of how many in our nation are becoming faint-hearted and disturbed over thoughts of the future, ask God to fill the church in America with **hope** so we will be strong and have our hearts filled with courage (Psalm 31:24).
- 12 Knowing that God is our salvation and a stronghold in the midst of struggles, pray that your church family will learn to sit silently before Him, putting their **hope** in the only One who can deliver them from all their troubles (Psalm 62:1-2).
- 13 Understanding that God chose us as His children in Christ Jesus before the foundation of the world, pray that we will honor Him by living lives that are “**holy** and blameless before Him” (Ephesians 1:4).
- 14 Pray that as children who are obedient to God, we will not be conformed to the former lusts that were ours in our ignorance, but like the Holy One who called us to Himself, we will be **holy** in all our ways (1 Peter 1:14-15).

- 15** Pray that as God has so graciously blessed the church in America, we in response will “cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting **holiness** in the fear of God” (2 Corinthians 7:1).
- 16** Pray that America will once again reverentially **fear the Lord**. Pray that His followers will walk in His ways, love Him sincerely, and serve Him with all their hearts (Deuteronomy 10:12).
- 17** In preparation for the soon return of Jesus, pray that the church in America will “**fear God**, and give Him glory, because the hour of His judgment has come” (Revelation 14:7).
- 18** Knowing that God takes notice of the one “who is **humble** and contrite of spirit, and who trembles at [His] word,” pray that every believer in your church family will walk before God with a genuine humility of heart (Isaiah 66:2).
- 19** Pray that Christians will **humble** themselves in the presence of the Lord, even to the point of mourning and weeping repentantly over their sins as God reveals to them any sinful attitudes or ways (James 4:9-10).
- 20** Pray that each member of your church family will practice **self-denial** by taking up his or her cross daily and following Jesus (Luke 9:23).
- 21** Pray for the leaders of your congregation to maintain a walk of **self-denial** by laying down ungodliness, turning away from worldly desires, and purposing to live righteously in this present age (Titus 2:12).
- 22** Pray that the men of your church family will draw near to God by **submitting** themselves to Him, resisting the devil, and fleeing from temptation (James 4:7).
- 23** Pray for your church family to find the grace it needs in humbly **submitting** to the spiritual authority and guidance of your church’s leadership (Hebrews 13:17).
- 24** Knowing this to be God’s will for every believer, please pray that your entire congregation will learn how to demonstrate **thankfulness** to God and others (1 Thessalonians 5:18).
- 25** Pray that Christians all over America will learn to “be anxious for nothing” by communicating with God about their concerns through prayer with **thanksgiving** (Philippians 4:6).
- 26** Pray that every Christian in America who engages in cold, mechanical, impersonal worship will repent and begin to “continually offer up a sacrifice of **praise** to God, that is, the fruit of lips that give thanks to His name” (Hebrews 13:15).
- 27** Just as the early Christians continued on a daily basis to fellowship together with gladness and sincerity of heart, pray that this generation of believers will come together regularly to study God’s Word and **praise** His holy name (Acts 2:46-47).
- 28** Pray that today’s church will be “dressed in readiness,” serving God obediently while being **alert** to watch for Christ’s return (Luke 12:35-36).
- 29** Pray that the men of today’s church will “be on the **alert**,” standing firm in the faith, being strong and truly acting like men while doing everything in love (1 Corinthians 16:13-14).
- 30** Pray that Christians will act like “sons of light and sons of day,” since we are “not of night nor of darkness.” Pray that we will “not sleep as others do, but . . . be **alert** and sober” (1 Thessalonians 5:5-6).
