

PRAYING INTO THE REVIVAL PROMISES OF 2 CHRONICLES 7:14


If I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or if I command the locust to devour the land, or if I send pestilence among My people, and My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land (2 Chronicles 7:13-14 NASB).

Humble Themselves . . .

- 1** Realizing that “GOD IS OPPOSED TO THE PROUD, BUT GIVES GRACE TO THE HUMBLE,” pray that Christians all over the nation will humble themselves daily in the presence of the Lord (James 4:6, 10).
- 2** Pray for Christians in your church family to understand that God requires them “to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly” with Him in their daily activities (Micah 6:8).
- 3** Pray that believers in your community will understand the value of humility and that it is “better to be humble in spirit with the lowly than to divide the spoil with the proud” (Proverbs 16:19).
- 4** Pray that your entire congregation will “be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; not returning evil for evil or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead” (1 Peter 3:8-9).
- 5** Pray that your church family will live with a daily recognition that pride and haughtiness lead to destruction, while humility precedes honor (Proverbs 18:12).
- 6** Pray that the younger members of your congregation will be clothed with humility and show respect to the elders and older members (1 Peter 5:5).
- 7** Pray that Christian pastors and congregations will humble themselves by assuming responsibility before God for the moral and spiritual erosion that has permeated our nation (Ezra 9:6-7).

Pray . . .

- 8** Pray that the members of your congregation will work together in order to pray regularly for “all men” and for all who are in positions of authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2).
- 9** Pray that your church family members will be committed to spending time alone with God in prayer before getting involved in the busy routines of crowded daily life and work (Matthew 6:5-6).
- 10** Pray that your closest friends will respond to life’s unexpected circumstances by first praying and seeking God’s will instead of fretting and becoming anxious (Philippians 4:6).
- 11** Knowing that God will “bring about justice for His elect who cry to Him day and night,” pray that your church family will pray at all times and not lose heart as they deal with life’s daily pressures and conflicts (Luke 18:1, 7).
- 12** Since we are rapidly approaching the return of Christ, pray that all believers will “be of sound judgment and sober spirit for the purpose of prayer” (1 Peter 4:7).
- 13** Pray that every born-again believer in your community will be devoted to prayer, “keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving” (Colossians 4:2).
- 14** Pray that the spirit of prayer for revival and spiritual awakening will spread throughout your community and that every Christian congregation will become a house of prayer (Isaiah 56:7; Matthew 21:13).



Seek My Face . . .

- 15** Knowing that God is “a rewarder of those who seek Him,” pray that He will increase our faith as we become even more committed to seeking Him for revival in America (Hebrews 11:6).
- 16** Pray that the members of your church family will not boast in their wisdom, numbers, or riches, but will seek to understand and know God at a greater level of intimacy (Jeremiah 9:23-24).
- 17** While continually seeking the face of God, pray that your church family will also “seek the LORD and His strength” (Psalm 105:4).
- 18** Pray that today’s church will seek God just as David did when he wrote, “One thing I have asked from the LORD, that I shall seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD and to meditate in His temple” (Psalm 27:4).
- 19** Knowing that God is not far from each of us, pray that every lost person living within your neighborhood will seek God with an earnest desire to truly find Him (Acts 17:27).
- 20** Before the members of your church family seek God in regard to having their needs met, pray that they will first focus on seeking God’s kingdom and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33).
- 21** As your church family sows into the things of God with their hearts committed to righteousness, pray that they will continue seeking the Lord “until He comes to rain righteousness” on them (Hosea 10:12).

Turn from Their Wicked Ways. . .

- 22** Pray that believers within your church family will grieve over their own sins and how those sins can affect the spiritual health of the entire church for generations (Nehemiah 9:1-2).

- 23** When it comes to repenting of our sins, pray that Christians will begin to help one another by having those who are spiritually healthy gently restore those who are struggling with sin (Galatians 6:1).
- 24** Pray that genuine sorrow and repentance will characterize the response of believers in America as God’s Spirit convicts them of sin (2 Corinthians 7:9-10).
- 25** Pray that those who are repenting from sin and turning to Christ will understand that real salvation is not evidenced by the words they say but by their willingness to do the will of their Father who is in heaven (Matthew 7:21).
- 26** Pray that as believers repent from their wicked ways, they will “turn to God, performing deeds appropriate to repentance” (Acts 26:20).
- 27** Pray that a contrite and lowly spirit will be chosen and experienced by believers as they become aware of personal and corporate sins from which they still need to repent (Isaiah 57:15).

I Will Hear from Heaven . . .

- 28** Knowing that “the LORD’s hand is not so short that it cannot save; nor is His ear so dull that it cannot hear,” pray that the church in America will genuinely repent of her sins in order to have the glory of God restored within our nation and our prayers heard (Isaiah 59:1-2).

I Will Forgive Their Sin . . .

- 29** Knowing that those who confess and forsake their sins will find compassion from God, pray that believers all over the nation will humble themselves by no longer trying to conceal their sins (Proverbs 28:13).

I Will Heal Their Land . . .

- 30** Pray that the church in America will “return to the LORD” with the understanding that “He has torn us, but He will heal us; He has wounded us, but He will bandage us” (Hosea 6:1).
